TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A) 27 AUGUST 2023

27-8-23 - 21st Sun in Ord Time

Hi all,

This week I just started the school of Preaching course at ACU.

We had a very engaging introductory talk by the Archbishop about Scripture and subsequently how each of us can preach better in our various contexts – parish, schools, diocese, community.

He was saying that we must be first open to the reality of the world. That God is communicating continuously with us. All we need to do is tune ourselves to hear God speaking to us through our prayer and reading the Word. He quoted a former Anglican Bishop – "today's society is dangerously bored". He was saying that people are so distracted that their personal world view is getting smaller and smaller. In regards to preaching, the role of the preacher is to make the world bigger for the listener. Their job is to encourage, invite and challenge the listener that God is indeed present in the world and whether I am truly listening to His voice or someone else's. The preacher is like a travel guide pointing out things that the person has seen previously but just not been aware of.

Just as God created light from the darkness, as preachers, our job is to enlighten the minds of all of those who sit in darkness and chaos. It's through the preacher's words that we create new worlds. As listeners we all need worlds of possibility. It is so important that we listen to the Word and allow it to speak to us. Learning to hear as Elijah calls it 1 Kings 19 – the voice of a thin silence.

If we can learn to understand the gaps and silences of the Bible, we will be better equipped to understand the gaps and silences of the world. A good question he posed to us is are we journeying with God or are we wandering aimlessly? Do I have a purpose?

Theme: Acknowledging God's Authority and Wisdom

The readings for the 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time prompt us to reflect on the themes of God's authority, wisdom, and the role of faith in recognizing His plan for our lives.

In the first reading from Isaiah 22:19-23, the appointment of Eliakim as steward in the king's household serves as a metaphor for the authority God bestows upon those He chooses. Just as Eliakim was entrusted with responsibility, we are reminded of the importance of stewarding our lives in alignment with God's will, recognizing the roles of leadership and service He might call us to

The responsorial psalm, Psalm 138, expresses gratitude for God's constant care and unfailing love. It's a reminder that our lives are anchored in His faithfulness, and our response should be one of humble acknowledgment of His goodness.

Romans 11:33-36 delves into the depth of God's wisdom and knowledge, beyond human comprehension. The passage leads us to a place of awe and humility, recognizing that God's ways are beyond our full understanding. This reflection on God's boundless wisdom invites us to trust His plans even when they don't align with our expectations.

In the Gospel passage, Matthew 16:13-20, Peter's confession of Jesus as the Christ is a pivotal moment. Jesus affirms Peter's insight and names him as the rock upon which He will build His Church. This exchange emphasizes the importance of acknowledging Jesus' divinity and the foundation of the Church on faith.

Collectively, these readings encourage us to surrender to God's authority, recognizing His wisdom and plans even when they seem mysterious or challenging. They invite us to respond with gratitude for His love and to embrace our roles as stewards of His grace in the world. Just as Peter's confession marked a turning point in the disciples' journey, these readings inspire us to anchor our faith in Christ and actively contribute to the growth of His kingdom through our words and actions.

Receiving Holy Communion from the Cup Trial of changes to parish practice

A significant number of our parishioners have expressed a desire to receive Communion under the form of both bread and wine, but are hesitant about drinking from the Cup because of the potential for viral infection.

In order to accommodate as many of our parishioners as possible, we will now change on a trial basis to the alternative of INTINCTION so that all are able to receive the Lord's Body and Blood under both kinds in a safe manner. This will be for a trial period only at OLHC, Hendra. The alternatives are these:

Receiving the Host in the hand.

Receiving the Host and dipping this Host into the chalice.

For the safety of all, drinking directly from the Cup will no longer be offered at this point in time.

Thank you for your understanding as we try to navigate these realities while remaining true to sound Eucharistic theology.

SOCIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY—27 August 2023

In a tradition reaching back to 1940, the Australian Catholic Bishops release major social justice statements each year in time for Social Justice Sunday. Through this tradition they contribute to the development of local Catholic Social Teaching. The statements encourage the Catholic community to reflect and act on social, economic and ecological issues. They remind us of the social dimension of the mission of the Church.

Australia's Bishops have released their 2023-2024 Social Justice Statement - Listen, Learn, Love: A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples.

This year, the Bishops invite the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC) to speak directly to us all. The Bishops call on us to begin a new engagement with Australia's First Peoples grounded in love and humility. It is their hope that we can build a civilisation of love through this new engagement.


